Global Youth Day began as a day of mission outreach in 2013 within the world Seventh-day Adventist Church. It is an outreach initiative held every year around the third Saturday in March. Since its inception the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists has expanded the initiative to include our children in the outreach, dubbing the outreach for the children as Global Children's Day. The initiative has grown greatly, touching thousands of young people and producing hundreds of creative service projects in local communities.

This year, even though COVID-19 has played a role in limiting the movement of our youth and children in the South Bahamas Conference, a number of our churches took part in the initiative. The theme, which stems from the Bible story of the woman at the well and Jesus' interaction with her encouraged the young people to reach out through Cultures, Colors, and Communities.

Here's what happened at some of our churches: The youth and children from the Bethel church distributed care packages in their community and share the gospel through

Adventist magazines. The children from the Good News church cared for the seniors by giving them a special visit and boxes of vegetables while the youth shared grocery packages to those in need in the community. Churches like Hillview, Grant's town, Philadelphia and Adelaide similarly shared fruits, grocery items, gift cards, magazines, prayers and other packages of 'hope'. Even churches in our family of islands were involved in the outreach. The young people from the New Macedonia church in South Andros went door to door sharing loaves of bread and literature. The youth from the Mount Thompson church, Exuma also shared with their community.

A rally was held by the Adventist Youth Ministries in Nassau to climax the numerous outreach projects. The afternoon was filled with music, praise and the youth and children were encouraged to continue to minister beyond the borders of Cultures, Colors, and Communities.

The gospel continues to be shared throughout the world as congregations throughout the Adventist community are accepting the mandate to 'Go'.
