Minimum Candidate Requirements

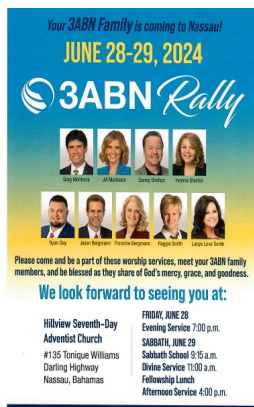
- Master's degree in educational administration or another field of education from an accredited institution.
