We know that ongoing stress can lead to a wide range of negative conditions including high blood pressure, stomach ulcers, depression, and other illnesses. The good news is that we don't have to continue to suffer from stress that causes illnesses.

Music is a 'universal language' that has a way of making us feel more connected to others. It does not need words to express emotion or validate what you're feeling. Appropriate music can take away sad and nervous feelings and make you happy, calm, and peaceful. The following words by an anonymous writer explain how music soothes our souls:

Music speaks what cannot be expressed, Soothes the mind and gives us rest, Heals the heart and makes it whole, Flows from heaven to the soul.—Anonymous.

As worshippers make their way quietly to their seats, the melodious sounds of the organ fill the sanctuary. Deeply moved by the music, one woman whispers to her neighbor, "What beautiful music! 'Hover O'er Me Holy Spirit' is my favorite hymn." The organist continues to play while another old lady weeps softly, as she thinks of her frailty and God's keeping power.
