## TIPS FOR MINISTERING TO THE SICK AND DYING



**M**inistering to the sick and dying are great opportunities to demonstrate unconditional love, but it is also scary. It is often scary because many do not know what to do or say when someone is sick or dying.

Even though ministry to the sick and/or dying should be understood as a natural part of the Gospel, this caring ministry does not come naturally or by happenstance. It requires a level of training, compassion, and understanding. Too often more pain is inflicted, and more emotional injury caused simply by the things said, done, or not done to the one who is sick, dying or grieving.

Here are two of six tips to assist in this ministry. The remaining four will be in a future article.

1. **Respect privacy and do not gossip.** It is so important to respect the privacy of those who are sick and/or dying. There are some people who do not want to tell anyone or only a few persons, what illness or medical condition they have. Respect that by not asking a direct question. Do not probe. On the other hand, if someone does tell what illness he or she has, do not gossip about it. Seek permission to share it. There are some people who have no scruples with sharing anything about their lives. However, this is not true for everyone. It is deeply disrespectful to share personal information one is not authorized to give. You do not need to know what the problem is in order to care or to pray for comfort or healing. When it is time to pray, do not ask “What illness do you have so I can pray about it.” That is intrusive. What you can do is ask “Is there anything specific you would like me to pray for?”

2. **Remember, silence is golden.** One of the greatest gifts one can give to someone who is ill or dying is the gift of being there--your presence. There is a warm and cuddly feeling we get to know that some care and that caring is best demonstrated by just being there and being attentive to the needs of the person. There is a beautiful secular song of the 1960s by the singing group called The Tremeloes, entitled “Silence is golden, but my eyes still see.” The storyline is not directly relevant to this topic, but I will make an effective application. More often than we believe, it is best to keep our mouths shut and our hearts and eyes open. When

visiting the sick and/or dying, this is most applicable. Just your presence is powerful. That’s the silence. “But my eyes still see” is the keenness and awareness of the one who is visiting the sick or talking to someone at church who is not well. It is noticing the dropping shoulder, the tear-stained face, the sudden loss of weight, the broken windows at the home, the empty food cabinets, etc., and then responding passionately. Too often we hear people say, “I did not even notice,” or “I did nothing,” or “I never cared.” It is true, silence is golden, but we can still see the pain. So lovingly respond.

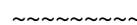
