A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT: HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS



Disasters can happen at anytime and anywhere, and when it strikes, you may not have sufficient time to respond. Families are able to cope best with emergencies by devising a plan in advance and working together before a disaster strike. The adage is still valid, "an ounce of prevention is worth more than a pound of cure." During the past 2 to 3 months, the South Bahamas Conference Disaster Preparedness Committee has been in meetings to discuss and devise plans in preparation for the 2020 hurricane season.

As with all countries within close proximity to the Caribbean Sea, The Bahamas is potentially at risk from hurricanes. The official hurricane season runs from June 1 to November 30, although storms have formed in other months. Historically, August, September, and early October are traditionally the months of highest risk.

Simple actions such as developing a family plan, being prepared, and keeping up to date with all weather-related announcements will save lives, not just for a hurricane, but for any type of disaster.

In the event that a disaster occurs during the COVID-19 public health emergency, communities will be faced with the additional challenge of possibly housing COVID-19 carriers in the designated shelters, should there be a need to evacuate from unsafe areas.

How Should We Prepare

· **Make an Emergency Plan** – Have an emergency plan of how your family would communicate, evacuate, and shelter in a place that addresses the needs of all family members, including seniors, children, individuals with access and functional requirements, as well as pets.

· **Build an Emergency Kit** – Build or customize an emergency kit that will sustain your household for three to five days without power. Drinkable water, non-perishable food and canned goods, manual can opener, medicines, first aid kit, candles or flashlights, matches, and a portable stove. During the COVID-19 pandemic,

include face coverings or masks, disinfectants, hand sanitizers, and other

cleaning supplies that you may need in an emergency.

· **Stay Informed** – Every family should have multiple methods for receiving emergency alerts. A battery-operated radio should be readily available, with extra batteries; you can also use your smart devices while still operating for legitimate state-sanctioned news and

information and not relying on or listening to unauthorized social media chatter.

· **Know Your Evacuation Zone** – Verify if you live or work in an area prone to flooding. Know which route you will use to evacuate safely.

During COVID-19, your family emergency plan should include what you might do differently, given the public health guidance. Your plan to evacuate should include where you might vacate to, given your family's circumstances.

If you have to evacuate, consider going to a hotel or other locations where you may have less contact with others. Bring critical emergency supplies, including face coverings, disinfectants, and hand sanitizers. Wear face coverings in public places, maintain social distancing six feet apart with those outside your household.

Please remember to keep your Bible and Sabbath School Quarterly safe, available and ready to go in case you have to leave. The word of God will sustain you during these difficult moments. "Trust in the Lord with all thine heart and He shall direct your path." **Proverbs 3:5,6**. Remember, the Lord has promised to always be with you, even in a hurricane or other disasters.

First Things First.
