### POSITION SPECIFICATIONS: QUALIFICATIONS, SCOPE, & COMPLEXITY OF DUTIES:

The **Audio-visual technician** should be able to:

- Install and maintain audio visual equipment including display devices, projectors, televisions, camera systems for productions, video teleconferencing systems (VTC), microphones, speakers and LIVE radio broadcasts.
- Setup and operate audio visual equipment for broadcasts, productions, meetings and conferences.
- Perform inventory management of equipment, wirings, and accessories to avoid any shortages.
- Perform equipment additions, removals, repairs, replacements, inspections and identify and resolve equipment malfunctions.
- Assemble and disassemble audio visual equipment as needed for production/broadcasts.
- Provide technical assistance to other Technicians when required.
- Maintain equipment in the radio station and television studio and store equipment in a clean, safe and organized manner.
- Be familiar with Marsis Playout & Simian (Broadcast Automation Software) and Blackmagic & ATEM Production systems.
- Knowledge of camera and lighting techniques is essential, and of Audition and Final Cut editing software is required.

### Maintaining a Healthy Weight
